Accomplishments

On July 31st, Captain Michel Poulin successfully completed the online course entitled "*Improving Fire Safety for Vulnerable Ontarians*".

Progress of current projects

- Finalization of the document related to FIRE MARQUE, a by-law adopted in 2016 that consists
 of recovering some of the costs incurred by the Fire Department through insurance
 companies during major incidents (By-Law Nº. 37-2016).
- Revision of the User Fees By-law No. 36-2007.

Professional activities

- Daycare children from *CENTRE ÉDUCATIF SOLEIL DES PETITS* visited *Sparky* and the firefighters at the fire station on June 10th.
- Firefighters participated in a field day at NOUVEL HORIZON School on June 20th.
- Firefighters participated in a fundraiser to promote good health organized by Constable Gratton with the Ontario Provincial Police, Hawkesbury Detachment, at the INDEPENDENT store on June 22nd.
- Fire drills were held on June 26th and 27th at 675 and 810 Portelance Street as well as 345 Hamilton Street.
- Firefighters took part in the activities surrounding Canada Day. Refreshing the young and old
 with water games and ensuring safety during the fireworks. In addition this year, at the
 request of the Recreation Department and with the authorization of the police force,
 firefighters provided traffic control on John Street in front of maison de l'île in order to let the
 people cross in a safe way at the end of the festivities.
- On July 31st, firefighters had to fight two fires, including a truck fire on Tupper Street and a structure fire (cooking) on Kipling Street, both fires almost simultaneously.

Future projects or activities

 On August 10th, firefighters will participate in the activities surrounding the arrival of the ROLLING DAMAGE Group, an organization that raises funds to help those who suffer from PTSD (Post Traumatic Stress Disorder) or OSI (Operations Stress Injury).

- Hiring a professional firefighter to replace Captain Berniquez.
- · Hiring new volunteer firefighters in the fall.
